INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Our Lady of Grace School will follow Northwest Local District plans for any weather related school closings or delays. School closings and delays will be communicated by phone using the telephone number you reported to Option C. Any changes to

your phone number should be changed in this system. OLG will not announce an early dismissal for snow. No students will be released to district transportation operating on an early dismissal for fear there will be no supervision at home when they arrive.

Our Lady of Grace Catholic School - 2 HOUR DELAY

<u>There will be no AM buses to OLG from any district opening on time when OLG is on a 2 hour delay</u>. In this situation, parents will have to provide their own transportation to school to accommodate the 10:00 a.m. start time.

- There will be AM buses to OLG from any district also opening on a 2 HOUR DELAY.
- There will be PM busing from all districts who are open (regardless of their start time)
- There will be no AM or PM busing from any district that is CLOSED.

Before and After School Care will begin as close to 6:30AM as safety and good judgment allow.

Feast of All Saints

In the times of great persecutions of the early Church, there were so many martyrs that it was impossible to commemorate each one on an individual day. Eventually, when the Church was given an old Roman temple to "All the gods," [pan = all; theos = gods], the Pantheon in Rome became a place to honor All the Saints and this great feast was born.

On November 1st we honor all the holy women and men who have gone before us, trusting in God's fidelity. We can each remember our own parish church as the "temple" which reminds us all the time that there is hope for us, because God has been faithful to our brothers and sisters before us.

Today, in the Gospel of the Mass, we have the *Beatitudes* for our reflection. We have to let the Beatitudes be the countercultural "good news" that they are.

Jesus is saying to each of us: Be surprised by what's a blessing in your life. It's not a blessing to be "spiritually rich" or to be full of success. It's not a blessing to "win" all the time. In fact, we have to almost turn upside down all our notions of blessedness, if we are to hear the "good news" Jesus brings us.

When we find ourselves "spiritually poor" we have nowhere else to turn but God. In our poverty we discover who our Savior is. In our poverty we open our hands and our hearts and can really pray.

When we find ourselves small or mourning or starving for justice that has eluded us, we have nowhere else to turn but God. In this helplessness we long for a Savior to comfort and satisfy us.

When we find that our heart has known God's mercy for our sins and has been purified by all the pain and wounds we have received, and we can offer forgiveness and mercy to others, actually becoming a peace maker, then we are ready for a special blessedness. Mercy will remain in our hearts and we will become children of God who can see our God face to face.

And when our trust in God earns us the ridicule of the world and our standing on the side of the poor and marginal leads to real rejection by the world, then we can really "rejoice and be glad" for we have been wrapped in what the Kingdom, the Reign of God is all about. For then we can look up at the Cross and give thanks and praise. For then we know that ours is the reward of all the martyrs and saints who have gone before us, marked with the sign of our faith.

All you saints of God, intercede for us this day, that we might see and believe in the Good News of the Cross and Resurrection in our daily lives.

Tips for Limiting Kids' Screen Time

<u>Model Healthy Electronic Use</u> It's important to role model healthy electronics use for your children. So before you binge watch your favorite Netflix series, remember to set a good example. Keeping the TV on for background noise all the time or scrolling through your phone any time you have a spare minute teaches your child bad habits.

Educate Yourself on Electronics Today's kids are tech-savvy. Most of them know more about electronics than adults do. That's why it's essential to stay up-to-date on the latest cell phone app or the newest social media craze. You can't teach your child about the risks of social media unless you understand the dangers. And you can't prevent them from playing violent video games if you don't understand the ratings. Make it a priority to learn about electronics and how they're affecting children.

<u>Create "Technology-Free Zones"</u> Establish zones in your house where you just don't allow electronics, like smartphones and laptops. For example, the dining room can be a great technology-free zone that is reserved for meals and family conversation.

Use Parental Controls Protect kids from explicit content on TV and online. Use parental controls that allow you to monitor what your children are viewing on TV and what they're doing online.

<u>Obtain Your Child's Passwords</u> Depending on your child's age and your values, it may make sense to obtain your child's passwords to any social media accounts or online accounts. It can also be important to establish rules about social media and what services you'll allow your child to participate in.

<u>Encourage Other Activities</u> Kids easily grow dependent on technology for entertainment. Encourage your children to become involved in activities that don't involve screens. Get your child to play outside, read a book or play a game.

Don't Allow Screen Media in Your Child's Bedroom It's impossible to monitor a child's screen media use if it's allowed in the bedroom. Don't allow your child to have a TV, video game system or computer in his room. This includes hand-held devices that many children use late at night, which can interfere with their sleep.
