Do Not Let Your Hearts Be Troubled

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God, so have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places - and I am going soon to prepare a place for you. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him: "Master, we don't know where you are going - how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. Then Philip said to Jesus: "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Jesus said to him: "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me, has seen the Father."

I love that passage from the Gospel of John. Whenever I read it, I recall a young boy that I met many years ago when I was working as a Pastoral Minister. He was a leukemia patient back in the days when that disease was a death sentence. But his parents would not allow any talk of death around their son. They hushed him whenever he raised the subject. Perhaps they thought that if they didn't talk about death, they could keep death away. His parents told me that he came down to breakfast one morning while he was at home from the hospital, and spoke to his mother about a dream he had had the night before. "Jesus came to me and talked to me in my sleep last night," the boy said. "Really?" his mother said. "What did he say to you? "Jesus told me he is building me a house and it is nearly finished." The boy died two weeks later. His mother told the story at the vigil service, the night before his funeral.

We are one with Christ. Christ lives in us as we live in Him. I have even heard it said that God has the same love for us that God has for Christ. If that is so, then think about the implications. Have you ever thought that you might be the only Christ some people will ever meet? If Jesus says to Philip, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father," doesn't Jesus want us, as his followers today, to live the reality of our Christianity and be able to say, "Those who have seen me have seen Jesus?" By their works you shall know them.

The letters on the plastic bracelets that say WWJD may have become a cliché, but the fact is, asking yourself regularly "what would Jesus do" is not such a bad idea. *Why?* Because the answer to that question will always be the same - *whatever love demands*.



Thomas says to the Lord in the Gospel, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" And what is Jesus' answer? "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Jesus is the answer - and what Jesus would do ought to be what those who believe in Jesus should *choose* to do.

As daunting as the task must seem, the challenge Jesus gives is for those who believe in him to be able to say, as a result of the works they do, that *those who see me, see Jesus*. Of course, doing those works may make you vulnerable. It's risky - you just might wind up the way Jesus did - misunderstood, on the cross, with God as your sole support. All this, and union with God here and here after.

The late theologian Father Gene Walsh once said: "Jesus promises us two things – Your life has meaning, and you're going to live forever." Then with a smile he adds: "And if you get a better offer – take it!"

That brave young boy with leukemia told his mother that Jesus was building him a house that was nearly finished. I believe that when that boy finally entered that house, he came to realize that *he, himself, had built the house* in union with Jesus through his acceptance of the Cross of his cancer and suffering - and through his firm confidence in the one who is the way, the truth, and the life. May we all have that same kind of courage, commitment, and faith!
